July 27, 2008 (Northern VA) – The search to find Jeddah, the US soldier's dog who disappeared from Washington – Dulles International Airport (IAD) on July 10, 2008 after the crate she was travelling in was damaged by United Airlines (UA), begins a new chapter today.

Owner John Weisner must report for duty overseas on July 28, 2008 and will depart from IAD later this evening ending his active (24/7) involvement in the search for Jeddah. Jeddah continues to be sighted by residents in the Centreville, VA area with the most recent sightings being on the evening of Saturday, July 26, 2008. Centreville VA is located approximately 11 miles south of the airport.

While John and his wife may not be able to remain active in the search efforts taking place in VA, numerous private citizens and animal rescue organizations already involved in the effort have re-committed themselves to continue all of the activities needed to help find Jeddah. The number and consistency of the sightings seems promising for successfully finding Jeddah.

There is an on-going need for volunteers to fill a variety of roles related to the search effort in Centreville, VA. Northern Virginia SPCA will lead the on-going search activities and coordinate volunteer efforts in conjunction with the HelpFindJeddah.com team.
